CHRISTMAS FUNDRAISER AUCTION

Preparation for this year's Christmas fundraising auction began in early August. With the help of many kind donors, we were able to feature tried-and-tested favourites, such as a stay in the beautiful Kilnsey Park, alongside new and exciting lots, such as go-kart racing and axe throwing,

Once again we were hosted by the fabulous Tennants Fine Art Auctioneers, who have been supporting the auction since it's conception in 2020.

In return for our efforts this year, which included being featured on BBC Radio stations across Yorkshire, our final figure raised was £6455 - almost £2000 more than last year!

The whole team were thrilled with the result, and there are big plans in place for the funds already. We regularly receive requests for advice and help which fall outside of project bounds, this money will help to fund staff time and equipment to respond to these requests. We hope that this will contribute to an even more cohesive and joined-up strategy to improve the rivers of the Yorkshire Dales in the coming year.




















AN UPDATE ON OUR YEAR

THE TEAM HAVE BEEN WORKING HARD ON 14 PROJECTS ACROSS OUR CATCHMENTS IN 2022. WE HAVE MADE BRILLIANT PROGRESS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR AND WOULD LOVE TO SHARE OUR HIGHLIGHTS WITH YOU!

- Volunteer leady dam building days 20 leaky dams constructed. From Arkengarthdale to Elmet, our volunteers have done an incredible job to bring Natural Flood Management to the forefront of what we have been up to.
- Natural Flood Management farm walkovers Our staff have been incredibly busy this year, both engaging landowners and planning the best interventions to naturally reduce flood risk.
- Volunteer seed collection of caliminarian plants we can't
 wait to incorporate this unique set of seeds into the future of
 some of our project sites.
- 200m of runoff draining works installed diverting contaminated water from metal mines away from rivers.
- Relocated and stockpilled 3000 tonnes of topsoil to eventually be used to help establish vegetation on contaminated spoil.
- Riparian fencing in collaboration with contractors we have installed over 700m of riparian fencing this year, and provided alternative drinking solutions for livestock.
- Soil sampling carried out in conjunction with a student of the University of Durham and Natural England.
- **Delivered river education to 44 classes** engaging with 1000 children
- Engaged with 1700 people at over 15 shows.
- **DVRN Catchment Partnership Working** has supported delivery in both the Foss and Nidd catchments.

We still have three months left of the financial year and we are very much looking forward to updating you on our final outputs in the New Year!

- Volunteer work expansion with a mix of funding including that raised from the auction, we are looking forward to expanding our volunteering capacity and creating a regular schedule of activities for our volunteers.
